Faculty Promotions

Four faculty members were promoted this year, three to full Professor and one to Associate

Professor. Drs. Jingxin Wang (Wood Science), John Edwards (Wildlife and Fisheries), and Jim Armstrong (Wood Science) were promoted to full Professor status by the University after a rigorous review of their work over the last five to six years. This promotion means that they have reached the pinnacle of their careers and have achieved both national and international recognition for research and teaching in their disciplines. Additionally, Dr. Jinyang Deng (Recreation) was promoted to Associate Professor and awarded tenure by the University.

Still Searching...

The Division currently has one open position, the Silviculturist position with the Forest Resources Management Program. The Search Committee, headed by Dr. Brooks, is currently working to identify the top candidates to interview. We would like to have an individual hired and in place by August 15th, but the reality is that we will more than likely have a person in place by January 1st, 2012. The importance of this faculty member to the Forestry Program, as well as other Programs in the Division and across campus is evident. Dr. Brooks and the Search Committee have their work cut out for them!

New Dean...

The news release quoted below was provided by the WVU President's office in mid-June. Dr. Rudy Almasy was hand-picked by the Provost's office to serve as interim Dean for the Davis College for approximately one year or until a new Dean is hired. The Provost has also indicated that an executive search firm would be used to assist with the new search for a Dean, after

the first search ended in failure this past spring. The anticipated start date for the new Dean is anticipated to be January 1, 2012.

The news release reads, "Dr. Rudy Almsy has been named interim Dean at West Virginia University's Davis College of Agriculture, Natural Resources and Design, Provost Michele Wheatly announced Tuesday. It will be Almsy's fourth stint as an interim dean for WVU, serving three times previously in this capacity for Eberly College of Arts and Sciences where he is a professor of English.

"We are lucky to have Dr. Almsy available to step in to what is a familiar role for him," Wheatly said. "Davis College will be in capable and experienced hands as we continue searching for the right person to lead the college that has defined WVU as a land-grant institution and that will lead our efforts to re-envision its future role in a 21st century land-grant institution."

In addition to serving as interim Eberly dean on three separate occasions, Almsy is former chair of the English Department, and has supervised the Undergraduate Writing Laboratory and the Business English Program. He has also served as associate dean for academic affairs and associate dean for college development.

"I am honored to have been selected for this assignment and look forward to working with a group of experienced and dedicated individuals in the Davis College," Almsy said.

Almsy graduated from MacMurray College with his bachelor's degree and then from the University of Minnesota with his master's and doctoral degrees.

Almsy's appointment is effective July 1; he replaces Cameron Hackney who has served since 2000. Dean Hackney leaves this position with a number of

accomplishments particularly in growing the extramural funding per capita in the College. He will serve as special assistant to the provost in the coming year, coordinating targeted interdisciplinary and international research initiatives.

Changes in Extension Leadership...

There was also a recent surprise retirement announcement from the Director of the WVU Extension Service, Dave Miller. Dave indicated that he would retire from his post as Extension Director at the end of June. Mr. Miller has been a true supporter of the Division and of the Appalachian Hardwood Center for many years and we will really miss his leadership and support. There has been no announcement regarding an interim Director for Extension as of this writing.

Enrollment

Undergraduate enrollment, based on projections provided by Dr. Denny Smith (Associate Dean for Academics in the Davis College), is expected to increase for most of the Programs in the Division yet once again. Although there has been no official tally, the largest anticipated growth is in Wildlife and Fisheries Resources which already has an enrollment of nearly 200 students. Recreation, Parks and Tourism Resources is also expected to see larger enrollment numbers in the coming year. Forest Management and Wood Science will see only moderate increases in undergraduate enrollment and we might even see a reduction in the number of Wood Science students for the 2011-2012 academic year. Graduate student enrollment is holding steady at the Masters level, while we have seen a significant increase in the number of Doctoral

candidates admitted to the Division over the summer.

Research Lab Renovations

At least six Division labs are slated for renovation in the coming year. These labs support nearly all of our Programs, specifically the Forest Management, Wildlife and Fisheries, and Wood Science Programs. We are hoping to create lab areas that can be flexible in their design, so that faculty can convert these lab areas to multiple configurations to address different research projects. Emphasis is also being placed on venting, air exchange, and safety through these renovations. The anticipated completion date for the renovations is late fall of 2012.
